The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Clerk.

STATEMENTS

Status of 2013/14 Constructed and Operations of Cattle Dips

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): The first statement from Hon. Joseph Leparsalaach to the Chairperson Agriculture. Yes Vice Chairperson Hon. Makal.

Hon. Makal: Thank you Mr. Speaker we have a comprehensive report after the Assembly that the previous report was not done well. Cattle dips as per order paper No. 002, statement No. 002/2020 dated 10th March 2020 asked by Hon. Joseph Ole Parsalaach MCA Ilchamus Ward.

i. If he can clarify on the cattle dips that were constructed across the County under flagship and ward development funding between 2013/2014 and 2018/2019 financial years?

In the financial year 2013/2014, the policy was that each ward was awarded Kshs. 1,500,000 to construct one cattle dip or to rehabilitate others as need may be. All money came from the ward fund. There are no flagship cattle dips constructed under flagship funds.

ii. What is the total number of cattle dips constructed per ward during the said period and their current status?

Mr. Speaker there is annex 1 and 2 on total constructed and renovated cattle dips projects per ward and its status and I request members to go through.

iii. What mechanisms is the County Government putting in place to ensure that all the cattle dips are fully operational to enhance value for money used on the said projects?

Among the mechanisms the County Government putting in place to secure value for money includes the following:

- a. There is a budget line for maintenance of cattle dips that's cattle dips which have problems such as flooding are given acaricide for reviving.
- b. The department engages with members of the County Assembly to put money for rehabilitation of cattle dips which are not functioning especially putting steel structures instead of wooden and provision of acaricide to jump start them again.
- c. Linkages; linking the dip committee with veterinary pharmaceutical companies to provide backup services and training of dip committees on the management of the dips.
- d. Revolving fund; the department encourages dip committees to gather reasonable dipping fee to gather replenishment of acaricide and repairs to the dip.
- e. All money collected shall be banked within 48 hours after collection by the treasurer to the cattle dip bank account.

- f. To control misuse of the revolving fund, the Baringo County Government requires the committees to rewritten letter to the veterinary department indicating the need and functions of the money requested for withdrawal from the cattle dip bank account for approval.
- g. It's a policy of the Baringo County Government that mandates the ward administrator to change the committees when need arises especially on non-functional dips in collaboration with the sub County veterinary officer.
- h. Each cattle dip under construction/renovation has in its Bill of quantities a budget for the purchase of acaricides to empower the dip committee to jump start their dipping programs.
- i. Training; as soon as a cattle dip is completed, a training session is mandatory during commissioning for efficient management and operation of the cattle dip.
- j. The department in consultation with the respective MCAs has been mobilizing any ward project savings, 10% retention fees (where there was a breach of contract), and seeking extra funding where critical need arises to ensure problematic projects are normalized, completed and operationalized.
- k. Where the type of soils (unstable clay loam), existed, such as Ilchamus ward and parts of Kerio Valley, steel tank insertion has been devised as a solution to correct the dip tank cracks occasioned by the same.
- 1. Advising on consolidation of the ward projects that has less funds to make each completed successfully.
- m. The department has increased the number of projects managers from one to four do as to hasten the works speed and improve on quality.
- n. The department in consultation with respective MCAs has advised against the construction of any more cattle dips in Tiaty Sub County and instead embrace mobile crush pens to be run by community youths groups as a stop gap measure to nomadic way of life.

This is the report thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Thank you, that was your response Hon. Leparsalaach what is your take?

Hon. Leparsalaach: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I appreciate the answers given by the committee this time except that I would have appreciated more if the member would have gone through my ward so that members would be able to give the status of their cattle dips within their regions and react to it.

For example in my Ward, you will find that they have written one twice. The said that One Loropili is complete and another one has been retendered. Now that brings a confusion and I am the only one who can tell the correct situation within that Ward and I would assume that that would apply to all Wards. Otherwise, they have tried and if they continue doing like this, it is a satisfactory answer especially on the side of mechanisms.

Mr. Speaker, when they said that during construction of any dip, they will make sure that within the Bill of Quantities, the acaricides component will be included. That is excellent unlike what

was happening before that a dip is constructed without an acaricide leaving the community with nothing to do.

(Loud Consultations)

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): There is a concern, information and contribution. Member for Kabarnet, lets here the concern first from Hon. Rono.

Hon. Rono: Thank you Hon. Speaker. I must congratulate the Committee. However, there is some confusion because my concern is; whatever is put under Saimo Soi is in Barwessa and whatever is put under Barwessa I don't know if this should be Saimo Kipsaraman maybe because Rebeko Kapkombe, I assume that is Bartolimo, in Saimo Kipsaraman. Of course in Saimo Kipsaraman, they are confusing a lot of things. This is a House of records, I could wish that we be provided with the correct information because if we interchange the Wards, it will mean differently because a name change can change the entire process.

My request to the Committee through Hon. Makal is that despite your good reporting, when you misspell the naming, it will distort the whole thing. Before I sit, where they say Kaptiony in Barwessa, they are saying complete but they are constructing now. Some of these reports might be misleading the way Hon. Ole Parsaalach has said and if the Members can go deeper and read, you might get some mismatch. Mr. Speaker I could have really appreciated this report but because of the misspelling and of course giving a wrong report that Kaptiony is complete and they are now constructing, I believe it is distorting the entire report. Thank you.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Member for Sacho.

Hon. Tarus: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I rise to give information. First of all, I would wish the Chair to that Committee to note that the answer to this statement is not correct because on Page 6 where I have numbered mine because it is not numbered where we have Sacho, it is talking of Kotunoi being complete. Then Sosion is correct. Kotunoi is not complete because the tank is leaking. On page 9 that should be in Baringo South a cattle dip No. 1 Ekeno Construction which we are told is complete then we have No. 1 again Ekenwa completion, we are told it is under construction. That is confusing and the Hon. Chair should clarify that.

Mr. Speaker, I would request that the Committee should be ordered to go on a fact finding so that they can come up with the actual truth because it is like the CEC is giving false information which is misleading the House.

(Applause)

If the information given about my Ward or another is not correct, then something should be done for the Committee to move around.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Member for Mochongoi.

Hon. Kimosop: Mr. Speaker, I thank the Committee Chair for the answer provided and also Hon. Ole Parsaalach for bringing this question. For record Mr. Speaker, it should be clear that the wording and sequencing is wrong just like Hon. Rono raised. My cattle dips are under Mukutani Ward and maybe it is coming backwards or forwards. I am reading number 7...maybe Mochongoi is coming this way and Mukutani that way. So that we don't waste much time, sequencing needs to be clarified then for the record Mochongoi...or maybe I start from the one that don't have much complain, Kibagenge, Tuluopso were handed over to the community and that was before we came to office and Sokotei.

The answer given for Sambakaa is right. We are having a challenge in the land that this facility was to take place and we kept rolling over this money and I can confirm that we have even rolled over for this FY. It is not right to say it is in procurement. It is not actually in procurement. We have rolled over the money because we need to agree as community on the land that this facility will sit on. Kapkechir and Mochongoi were never handed over to the community and that is something that the Committee needs to note. For the record, Mochongoi cattle dip was a rip off. the BQ of what they were supposed to do and what they did is contradictory.

They were supposed to take away all the iron sheets and put new ones and a few other things according to the BQ. They went and painted the iron sheets that were there.

(Laughter)

The Engineer disappeared and could not pick calls. The Committee wrote letters warning the Firm not to be paid until they clear the work. These are transitional projects that were on-going when we came in and if you look at all these projects, they are like rip offs. If you go across my Ward, you will see projects that were started, paid and never handed over. This happened between April 2017 and slightly before we resumed office but we had not taken charge properly. So, I agree that the Committee needs to do a fact finding mission. Maybe Mr. Speaker you can direct that they go back to all these cattle dips and we get a proper report.

But my challenge is that if we get a proper report, what do we do with it? The Chair Implementation is here. When the ECD team went round, we said that some of the Companies be blacklisted. That was in the report but none of the Companies was blacklisted. What we approve really needs to be acted upon. Thank you.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Member for Kabarnet then I will come to Mhe. Parkei.

Hon. Kibet: Thank you Mr. Speaker. First I recognize the efforts of the Committee, they tried but Mr. Speaker this was a flagship project and when you look at the status report, like in my Ward I could see Kaptara Cattle dip which was messed up because they were supposed to install a steel tank but the contractor came with a 'mabati' but it did not work. Metipso the same, they were suppose to put a water tank but it is now collapsing.

Mr. Speaker, what is inflicting most of these projects it was like the department was not sure of what they wanted. When you look at how Wards were given, some were getting like 10 and others getting few...

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Deputy Speaker what is the information?

Hon. Cheboiwo: Mr. Speaker, the Member is saying that some Wards were allocated more projects than others. Most of them are Ward Based projects. Thank you.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Proceed Hon. Kibet.

Hon. Kibet: I think that was not even my point. I was not complaining that others were getting few or more. But the issue that is afflicting most of these projects like if you look at the ones for Tiaty you will see that there is a place they say vandalism and nomadism. Most of these projects Mr. Speaker were initiated, completed but they were not handed over to the committees so they were not launched.

So you will find like in my Ward I have like three or four which are complete but they are not in use. I was expecting in this report for the department to tell us which is the way forward because

once a dip is complete it is normally the contractor will pour water in to it but now there should be the acaricides so when you visit most of them there is water and there is no acaricides.

Another issue that must be looked in to is that the committee recommends that for those like Tiaty and maybe Marigat they are recommending the mobile dips but if you are to recommend the mobile and you don't provide... you see like when you say mobile how do you do, is it in locations, like in Kerio valley here people are so mobile with their animals so if it is possible it can be attached to the same committees so that they can serve the people.

Mr. Speaker, the other thing that I want to also point out is that when we look at these investments, they are huge investments and if we are not getting value for money for this then my wish is that the way we did for the ECDs because we moved the ECDs to a report status so I think this statement can be escalated to a report status because the relevant committees can go for a serious fact finding so that we are able.

Mr. Speaker, I am surprised that even the high yielding Wards have the least investments in these cattle dips, my colleague here is talking about the Ward fund, it was a Ward based project that most productive parts of Baringo. Baringo is known for production of livestock is investing less in the disease preventive measures.

Mr. Speaker there is something that needs to be looked in to that the committee or the department should be able to capture it that we cannot be investing so much to... I think what informs this is the traditional notion that those who are keeping the exotic ones are so serious in dipping and those who are investing on the indigenous or the Zebu they have this perception that they are resistant but that is now a policy. I was expecting the way they are enumerating here to highlight that the Wards which have not invested in the modern farming they seem not to budget for these and we can go in to that. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Members remember this is just a statement we will not really want to take much time but I will go to the last one Member of Mukutani.

Hon. Parkei: Thank you Mr. Speaker. First of all, I thank all the Members who have come up with this report. I want to correct the Member for Barwessa who was complaining about the arrangements of the dips but when we looked into it with him, we found that the numbers are just the same totals for every dip in the lower side, so you start with the dips and then you get the total number of the dips downwards.

Mr. Speaker, I am a committee Member and most of these dips are complete. What most Members are complaining about is the handing over of the projects which start with the department in consultation with the area MCA. So it is upon you with the department to arrange for the commissioning of the dip and handing over to the community.

I can see that most of the dips here are complete so it is upon the Members to wake up and follow up with the department to make sure that all the dips that have been completed are handed over to the community to make use of them. If there are some dips which have not been completed it is good for the Members to let us know; say if there is a dip which has been written here that it is complete and the Member knows that it is not complete it is good for them to alert us to go for fact finding and we cannot go for fact finding for all these dips Mr. Speaker sir.

Mr. Speaker, it is good for them to give us any dip in their Wards that is questionable for our committee to fast truck and check if it is true or false. The department has done a good job so it is upon us also as Members to follow up with this matter. Thank you.

The Speaker (Hon. Kiplagat): Hon. Vice Chair for Agriculture Committee, I think the Members have just said what you would have said on behalf of the committee. Now Members have seen your concerns which you have raised and before we even decide whether a fact finding is necessary or not, I think it will be imperative for the Members who have issues to liaise with the committee first, let them take time to interrogate this report one by one and then liaise with the committee on Agriculture and if need be then we will always take the next step but first of all let us do first things first.

It is upon the Members to look at the report, scrutinize and liaise with the committee and we will see how it goes. So I think we will leave it at that.
