#### 7. STATEMENTS

**017/2025: Hon. Linah Sote MCA, Baringo County,** seeks a statement from the **Chairperson, Health Services Committee** on the following matters of concern;

THAT, most parts of Baringo County are snake invested and snake bites has caused a significant number of deaths if not injuries in the recent past.

AWARE THAT, Dispensaries and Health Centers provide emergency and first aid services in case of snake bite before any referral is made,

NOTABLY, most of these facilities are not stocked with anti-venom drugs to rescue lives in case of snake bite.

- NOW, the department to provide the list of County facilities that are stocked with anti-venom drugs in Baringo County
- ii. The department to also give the records of the victims of snake bites for the last one year within the County?
- iii. What other measures has the County Government put in place to ensure antivenom drugs are available in all County Health facilities?

019/2025: Hon. Linah Sote, MCA, Baringo County, seeks a statement from the Chairperson, County Heritage, Gender, Culture and Community Services Committee on the following matters of concern;

THAT, article 53 (1) of the constitution of Kenya provides for the Rights of every child that include the right to free and compulsory basic education, basic nutrition, shelter and health care.

FURTHER, the Menstrual hygiene policy 2019-2030 aims to ensure women and girls can manage menstruation hygienically, freely and with dignity, providing access to information, menstrual product, services and facilities as well as waste disposal.

AWARE THAT, lack of sanitary products affects the education and learning for the girls as it may prevent them from attending school and distract them from achieving their educational dreams.

CONCERN THAT, poverty and lack of Sanitary towels may lead to early childhood marriages and teenage pregnancies;

- i. What plans has the County Government put in place to ensure that school going girls are provided with sanitary towels having in mind that many children come from humble backgrounds; others are orphaned and may not afford to acquire the basic product.
- ii. Has the County Department allocated funds aimed at purchasing the sanitary products? If yes, how much was allocated?
- iii. What has the County Government done in terms of legislation to facilitate access to sanitary materials by girls, fight against the Gender Based Violence (GBV) and promote girl child welfare in the County?

#### 7. STATEMENTS

**004/2025:Hon. David Sitoi, MCA, Bartabwa Ward,** seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Finance and Economic Planning Committee** on the following matters of concern;

**THAT**, Article 196, 201(a) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for public participation;

**THAT**, the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Finance and Economic Planning is mandated to lead the Annual Development Plan (ADP) and the Annual Budget for the County.

**THAT,** during the 2023/24 FY, the following projects, totaling **Kshs. 8, 137,500** were well identified in the ADP and subsequently allocated budgets for by the residents of Bartabwa Ward.

- a) Construction of Bukwo and Beibosok foot bridges Kshs.3, 000, 000,
- b) Fuel for dozing works, Kshs.2, 000,000
- c) Construction of Kapturo Dispensary staff houses Kshs.1, 175,000
- d) Drilling of Kokwomoi borehole, Kshs.1, 300,000
- e) Pipeline extension for Terik borehole, Kshs. 662, 500

Additionally, the said projects have not been implemented and have not been included in the 2024/2025FY, as shelved or rolled over projects.

- i. Can the County department of Finance & Economic Planning confirm that these projects were in the 2023/24 FY Budget, and if yes, confirm that the projects were not implemented?
- ii. If the aforementioned projects were not implemented, can the department give reasons why they were not included in the 2024/25 FY Budget?

iii. What measures will the department put in place to ensure that projects are not lost during the implementation stage?

(The Committee on Water and Irrigation to conduct a fact finding mission to ascertain question d) drilling of Kokwomoi borehole, Ksh. 1,300,000 and e) Pipeline extension for Terik borehole, Ksh. 662,500 and report back to House, the County Treasury to confirm funds for a, b and C)

(The County Executive Committee Member Finance and Economic Planning, County Executive Committee Member Water and Irrigation, Chief Officer Water and Irrigation, Immediate former Chief Officer Water and Irrigation was to appear before the House on 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 at 9:30 am)
