## **7. STATEMENTS**

**003/2025 Hon. Julius Ng’otie, MCA, Ravine Ward**, seeks statement from the **Chairperson Trade, Tourism and Co-operatives Committee** on the following matters of concern;

**THAT**, the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for devolution of Trade and Co-operative Societies and that, the County Government of Baringo since the inception of devolution has been budgeting and disbursing loans to Small Medium Enterprises (SMEs).

**THAT**, Article 195(1) of the CoK 2010 as read together with Standing Orders 196(5) gives the County Assembly powers to compel production of documents and any important information.

Pursuant to the above;

- i. What was the initial amount budgeted for the SMEs?
- ii. What amounts have been disbursed and recovered since inception?
- iii. Give the status of repayments/recovered per Sub-County.
- iv. Provide the list of non performing accounts, giving the total sums of the loans defaulted.
- v. From the initial amount, how much has since been added to the Kitty in the subsequent County budgets?
- vi. Does each Sub-County have well updated ledger books? If so, please furnish the House with the updated ledger books?
- vii. Can each Sub-County operate a separate account for easy follow up?
- viii. Please give details on how the current Kshs.2 million was disbursed as per each Sub-County.

- ix. Give the status report of the Baringo County SMEs since inception to date per each Sub-County and;
- x. A detailed list of SME loans beneficiaries since inception as per Sub County.
- xi. Provide an updated ledger book for every loanee for the last three years SME disbursements.
- xii. Furnish this House with the latest updated Bank statement.

**013/2025: Hon. Sam Lourien Limo, MCA, Tirioko Ward**, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson, Health Services Committee** on the following matters of urgent concern:

THAT, health is a fully devolved function with mandate to address all matters health for a healthy county and society;

Sugut dispensary staff house was allocated Kshs1.5 million in the 2022/2023FY for the nurse house. The contractor was identified and awarded and the site handover to him/her he and began the work 2023 up to now the house is at Lintel.

- i. What was the contract sum of the project and how much has been paid to the contractor so far?
- ii. Was the works supervised by the department?
- iii. Now that the work has stalled for two years, what is the department doing to ensure that the work is completed expeditiously?
- iv. What plans has the County Government put in place to ensure that Sugut dispensary is fully equipped and adequately staffed once the construction is completed in order to serve the people of Tirioko location?

**015/2025: Hon. Sam Lourien Limo, MCA, Tirioko Ward**, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson, Health Services Committee** on the following matters of urgent concern:

THAT, health is a fully devolved function with mandate to address all matters health for a healthy County and society;

Nurses of three dispensaries within Tirioko Ward were recalled and reposted. The nurse of Kamurio dispensary was recalled in the year 2023 and reposted elsewhere without a replacement. The nurse for Ptikii dispensary was recalled in the year 2022 and reposted elsewhere again without replacement. The nurse for Krezee dispensary was recalled in the year 2024 and for the umpteenth time reposted elsewhere without a replacement.

- i. Why are nurses from the above mentioned stations recalled and reposted elsewhere without replacements?
- ii. Two of the said dispensaries (Kamurio and Krezee) served two locations each while the third one (Ptikii) served the local school community, a community of more than 10,000 people? What informed the decision to deny all these communities the health services provided by the recalled nurses yet they direly need and deserve these services like other Kenyans elsewhere in this Country?
- iii. What plans has the County Government put in place to ensure that this gross anomaly is corrected and the affected communities and people of Tirioko receive their well-deserved health services pursuant to Article 40 of the Constitution and other relevant laws of the land regarding citizen rights?
- iv. What plans has the County Government put in place to ensure that such gross acts which violate the constitutional and legal rights of the people are not repeated within Tirioko Ward or any other part of this County?

### **7. STATEMENTS**

**004/2025:Hon. David Sitei, MCA, Bartabwa Ward**, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Finance and Economic Planning Committee** on the following matters of concern;

**THAT**, Article 196, 201(a) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for public participation;

**THAT**, the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Finance and Economic Planning is mandated to lead the Annual Development Plan (ADP) and the Annual Budget for the County.

**THAT**, during the 2023/24 FY, the following projects, totaling **Kshs. 8, 137,500** were well identified in the ADP and subsequently allocated budgets for by the residents of Bartabwa Ward.

- a) Construction of Bukwo and Beibosok foot bridges **Kshs.3, 000, 000**,
- b) Fuel for dozing works, **Kshs.2, 000,000**
- c) Construction of Kapturo Dispensary staff houses **Kshs.1, 175,000**
- d) Drilling of Kokwomoi borehole, **Kshs.1, 300,000**
- e) Pipeline extension for Terik borehole, **Kshs.662, 500**

Additionally, the said projects have not been implemented and have not been included in the 2024/2025FY, as shelved or rolled over projects.

- i. Can the County department of Finance &Economic Planning confirm that these projects were in the 2023/24 FY Budget, and if yes, confirm that the projects were not implemented?

- ii. If the aforementioned projects were not implemented, can the department give reasons why they were not included in the 2024/25 FY Budget?
- iii. What measures will the department put in place to ensure that projects are not lost during the implementation stage?

***(The Committee on Water and Irrigation to conduct a fact finding mission to ascertain question d) drilling of Kokwomoi borehole, Ksh. 1,300,000 and e) Pipeline extension for Terik borehole, Ksh. 662,500 and report back to House, the County Treasury to confirm funds for a, b and C)***

***(The County Executive Committee Member Finance and Economic Planning, County Executive Committee Member Water and Irrigation, Chief Officer Water and Irrigation, Immediate former Chief Officer Water and Irrigation to appear before the House on 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 at 9:30 am.)***

(Provide a comprehensive report of all the projects under the Department of Water and Irrigation for the financial year 2023/2024 and 2024/2025 specifically on the following key areas of concern;

- i. Projects that have been paid detailing the budgeted amount, contractor, contract sum and contract period.
- ii. Projects that have been awarded and not paid giving reasons for non-payment.
- iii. Projects that have not been awarded detailing their procurement status and challenges faced in implementation
