6. NOTICE OF MOTION

(Hon. Kipruto Kimosop – MCA, Mochongoi Ward)

AWARE THAT, Article 188 of the Constitution provides for alteration of county boundary by taking into consideration population density, physical and human infrastructure, historical and cultural ties, cost of administration, views of communities affected, geographical features and objects and devolution of governments;

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, Article 10 of the Constitution provides for the promotion of national values and principles of good governance which include human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality and human rights;

COGNIZANCE of section 3(b) of the Inter -governmental Relations Act, 2012 which provides for a framework for consultation and cooperation amongst county governments and that county boundaries are highly protected in the 2010 Constitution and that the status quo as at its promulgation must be respected at all times by all stakeholders;

APPRECIATIVE of the native English law principle of good neighborliness and acknowledging the fact that land has from time immemorial been a highly emotive issue;

CONCERNED THAT, in the recent past, there has been encroachment of areas bordering Marmanet forest within Mochongoi ward in Baringo South Sub-county, posing a threat to peaceful coexistence among the communities which may further spark political tension, disharmony and heightened animosity if the situation is not addressed at the earliest instance;

DISTURBED THAT, recently unknown surveyors accompanied by a contingent of security officers were spotted doing survey work and demarcation of land inside Baringo County territory;

NOW THEREFORE; this motion urges the County Government of Baringo to:

- i. Immediately move with speed in conjunction with Laikipia County Government and address the encroachment within Marmanet forest and other

areas with imminent encroachment within Baringo County Governments boundary.

- ii. Pending intervention by county governments, the surveyors and security agents to desist from conducting any further survey or any similar activities pertaining the foretasted boundaries.
- iii. Pursuant to Article 188 of the Constitution as read together with part one of the fourth schedule, the national government through IEBC to undertake independent boundary review between Baringo and Laikipia Counties before the 2022 general elections.
- iv. Engage all leaders (MCAs, Members of Parliament, Senators and Governors) from both County Governments to amicably resolve the escalating conflicts arising from the boundary disputes.
