## **7. STATEMENT**

**002/2022: Hon. John Tarus, MCA, Sacho Ward,** seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Health Services Committee** on the following matters of concern:

During the Annual Development Plan for 2019/2020, the people of Sacho Ward allocated Ksh. 2.5 Million during public Participation for Kaplel dispensary but the said funds have not been utilized and subsequently removed from the budget.

- i. Why were the funds not utilized?
- ii. Give reasons as to why funds were removed from the budget?
- iii. What plans has the Department put in place to ensure that the people of Sacho benefits from the said funds as intended?

## **8. MOTION**

### **APPROVAL OF NOMINEES FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF COUNTY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS**

(The Chairperson, Committee on Appointments)

**WHEREAS**, the Committee on Appointments is established pursuant to Standing Order 190(4) which provides for vetting and consideration by the County Assembly, appointments under Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution, in this case the County Executive Committee Members;

**AWARE THAT**, Section 35 and 36 of the County Governments Act as read together with Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution provides for the power of

the Governor to nominate and appoint County Executive Committee Members with the approval of the County Assembly;

**FURTHER APPRECIATIVE THAT**, Section 35 (1) of the County Government Act provides that the Governor shall, when nominating members of the County Executive Committee consider the following:

- a) The composition of the County Executive Committee reflects the community and cultural diversity of the County; and
- b) Take into account the principles of affirmative action as provided for in the Constitution.
- c) Consideration of two thirds gender rule;
- d) Representation of the minorities, marginalized group.

**ACKNOWLEDGING THAT**, Section 36(1) provides for roles of County Executive Committee Members in addition to the functions provided under Article 183 of the Constitution;

**AWARE THAT**, the Governor Hon. Benjamin Cheboi, vide a letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 forwarded to the Clerk, the list of ten proposed County Executive Committee Members for vetting and subsequent consideration for approval by the County Assembly pursuant to the provisions of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals Act) of 2017;

**SUBSEQUENTLY**, upon commitment to the Committee on Appointments, the nominees appeared before the Committee on 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of November 2022 at the Kenya School of Government and were vetted on their suitability for appointment of the **County Executive Committee Members** to the various Departments in Baringo County;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in view of the foregoing, this Motion urges the County Assembly of Baringo to **consider** and **adopt** the Report of the Committee on

Appointments approving the following nominees to the various departments upon a successful vetting process:
